The show delves into family dynamics, secrets, awakening, and dancing. It's a fusion of different elements packed into an hour-long performance.

The Fringe provides a platform for diverse stories and perspectives, and this year, there's a growing openness and interest in narratives that explore personal journeys, family dynamics, and the impact of secrets. People are seeking connections and understanding, and our show can resonate with a wide range of audiences. We have also made sure to incorporate accessibility features like audio description and captions, making it inclusive and accessible to everyone. So, the Fringe is the perfect place to share this deeply personal and thought-provoking piece.
